## Family Seminar

This month Chip has been giving a weekly seminar on training children within the family. People in this culture are non-confrontational and tend to live for today instead of planning for the future. This creates a number of difficulties related to raising children. Chip is trying to focus on helping parents see that they need to actively guide their children's development by confronting bad behavior and encouraging good behavior. He is also trying to show parents that how they raise their children now will have life-long consequences for their children. Additionally we are trying to emphasize that parents need to be good examples for their children. Our church as a few young couples who have the potential to live their married lives and raise children by biblical principles. Pray that they will understand and apply these studies to their everyday lives.

## Documentation

For the Hospital: This fall we revised the hospital by-laws to integrate better into the ever-changing Brazilian medical-legal system. We are now reapplying for "Public Utility" (tax privileged) status and federal recognition as a social assistance entity so that we can import donated supplies and to offer Dr. Mark Thompson a work contract.

For Dr. Mark Thompson: Dr. Thompson is now in the same process that Chip went through to get his license. We are praying that the experience Chip gained will help expedite this process. Dr. Thompson has already passed his Portuguese language exam and will take written and oral medical exams next month. Pray that these will go well. While Mark is going through this process Chip is working on offering him a work contract through the Hospital. Pray that this can be done w/o many hitches.

### Hospital Evangelism

As we have had more patients in the hospital with routine surgery our hospital evangelism team has been quite busy. We have two employees (one from the laboratory and one from sterilization) who take some time out from their "normal" work to share the gospel with patients. We also have a number of volunteers that come regularly to share the Good News with our patients. Several patients have made professions of faith and many have expressed interest in follow-up visits. We are now coordinating this follow-up program and tracking to see how effective we are being in helping people

understand the Gospel. One young lady, Rosimar, was recently shot four times by her husband who was drunk. Three wounds were superficial, but one injured her rectum and gravid uterus. In surgery she lost her baby and received a colostomy. As she recuperated in the hospital her initially bitter disposition mellowed as she came to understand the Lord could use this horrible situation in her life to bring her life long happiness through developing a personal relationship with Him. Rosimar is now convalescing at home, actively studying her Bible, and awaiting another operation to reverse her colostomy.

As people have responded to the Gospel, both within the hospital and without, we are now finding it difficult to find time to study with each person individually. Pray that we will have wisdom in guiding the spiritual development of these new believers as we work hand-in-hand with the leadership of Faith Baptist Church. Family/Children
